mulberry bush.



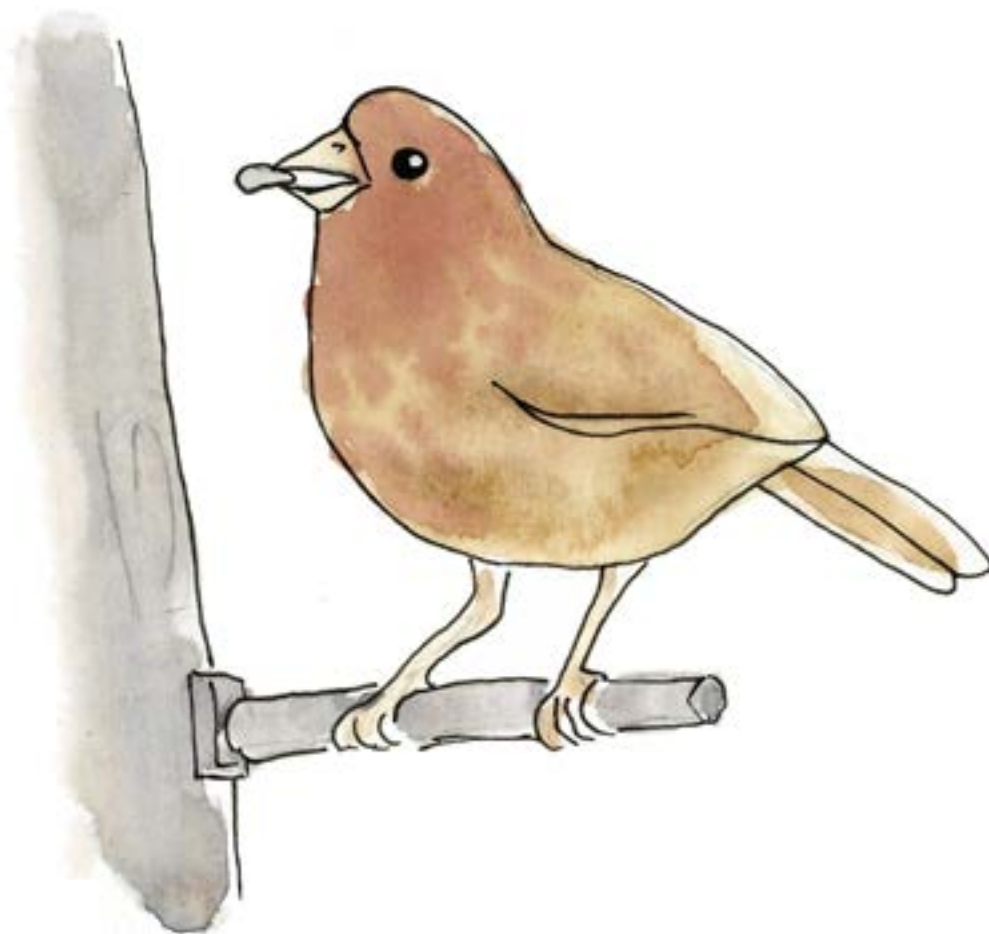
The Painted Bunting is

the feeder.



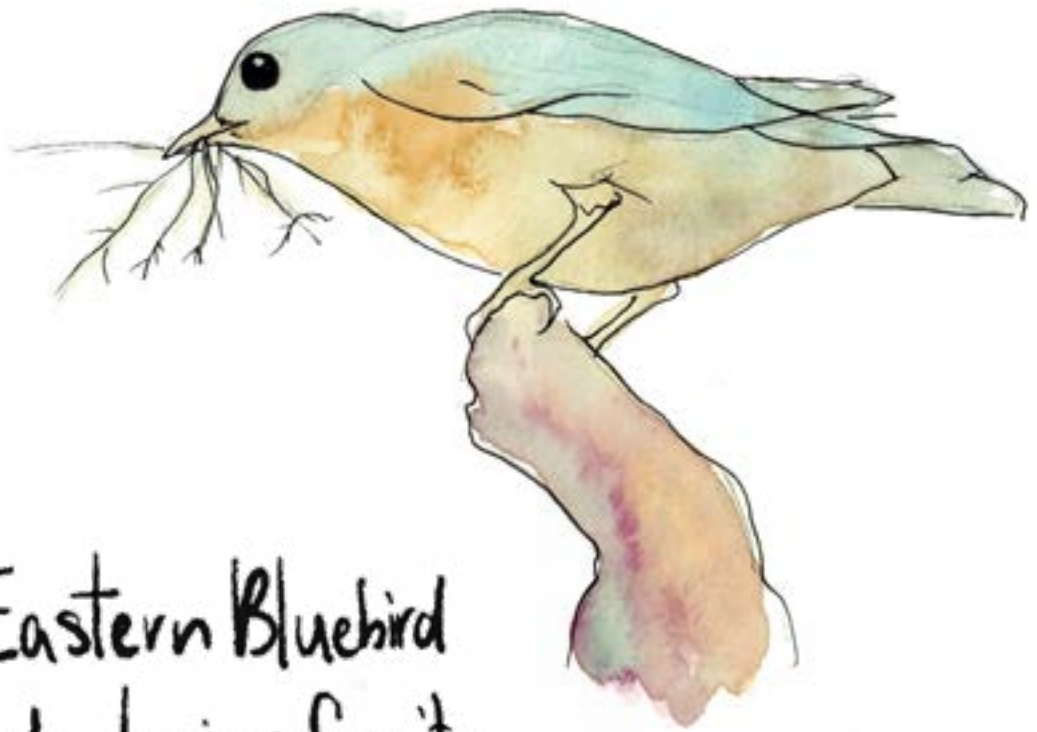
The American Goldfinch
